On June 8 we have the opportunity to visit this historic (1897), world’s oldest operating hydro-electric plant located on the Hudson River off Rt. 4/32 between Waterford and Mechanicville, near Lock 2. We hope to gather at a nearby restaurant (TBD – any suggestions?) so we can collectively travel to and arrive at the plant.
