You are cordially invited to attend the Schenectady Elfuns Luncheon to be held at The Glen Sanders Mansion, One Glen Ave., Scotia, NY 12302 on Tuesday May 16, 2017. Our speaker will be Michael Adler.

The presentation will feature the spectacular scenery of the Southern Alps, the dramatic fiords of the southwest coast, and the volcano's and thermal features in the "Mt Doom" area of the Northern Island featured in the Lord of the Rings. The talk will also highlight the geologic origin of New Zealand which began 500 million years ago as a result of the collision of the Pacific and Australian plates. However, the New Zealand we now know only emerges from the sea 25 million years ago and continues to evolve. The most dramatic geological feature in New Zealand is the alpine fault which runs the entire length of the Southern Island and is caused by the colliding Pacific and Australian plates.
